Distribution Guidelines

Distributions may be recommended to qualified 501(c) (3) organizations that are U.S. public charities.

The Jewish Foundation charges a 1% annual administrative fee on all funds. Fund distributions may only be for charitable purposes. As required by the IRS, the Jewish Foundation has legal control over all donations to funds.

The annual distribution amount is determined by the Foundation's spending policy (as of December 2024, spending policy is 4.00% of the funds 12/31 value - spending policy may change from time to time).

Contributions to Build a Tzedakah Funds are fully tax-deductible.

Build a Tzedakah enables young adults to establish their own fund, giving them the ability to positively impact their community and building a foundation for lifelong giving.

Teens who open a fund receive an artistic certificate created by Jeanette Kuvin Oren, a local artist. They receive the recognition for their commitment at their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.



Build a Tzedakah and My Very Own Tzedakah follow the same guidelines for setting up a fund.

• A child/teen, parents, guardians, family, or friends can kickstart a personalized Tzedakah Fund by contributing \$600. All ages receive a matched gift from a generous community donor of \$400. This elevates the fund to \$1,000.

\$600 initial funding + **\$400** match = **\$1,000** impact

• They can create a lasting tribute to a celebrate special occasions like a child's birth, birthdays, college admissions, holidays, or other special occasions. Teens can start their Tzedakah Fund by contributing funds from their Bar or Bat Mitzvah gifts.
